

The [Clean Water State Revolving Fund](#) (CWSRF) is a federal-state partnership program that provides financing for water quality and water infrastructure projects across the United States. Each state and Puerto Rico manages its own CWSRF program, usually as part of its environmental or water agency. For newcomers to this program, it is important to know where you can find more information on the options available in your state.

REVIEW YOUR STATE'S INTENDED USE PLAN AND PROJECT PRIORITY LIST

- Every CWSRF program develops an Intended Use Plan (IUP) annually to outline how they intend to use CWSRF funds during a fiscal year. This strategic document details project priorities, funding allocations and program goals, ensuring transparency and alignment with state water quality objectives. IUPs must be made available for public review and comment. States may also hold public meetings or hearings to discuss the IUP. These sessions are opportunities for stakeholders to learn about proposed projects and provide input.
- States develop Project Priority Lists (PPL) that reflect state-specific environmental and public health priorities.
- Projects must be on the PPL to receive financing from the CWSRF.
- PPLs may be changed during the year, as long as the projects have been previously identified through the public participation process.
- IUPs and PPLs are updated every year and published on each state's CWSRF website. They are often available as downloadable PDFs. Reviewing them can help you understand funding priorities and prepare for future applications.
