# **Nomination Form: Outstanding Community Conservation Award**

The Nebraska Association of Resources Districts (NARD) sponsors an annual Outstanding Community Conservation Award to:

- Reward outstanding community conservation efforts in Nebraska
- Promote community conservation projects in Nebraska
- Provide recognition to NRDs and the NARD

#### Criteria

- Communities, individuals and organizations are eligible
- Conservation activities must be for conservation purposes. Examples: windbreaks, shelterbelts, wildlife habitat, landscaping, woodlots, erosion control, invasive species management, etc. Ornamental and horticultural plantings may be incorporated in the conservation plan.
- Conservation efforts must be rural or urban in public or private ownership.
- A brief summary of the conservation objective, present status and plans for the future should be included.
- Conservation activities and promotional efforts by the nominee will be considered.

#### **Nominations**

- 1. Nominations must include:
  - o Nominee name, address, telephone number
  - o Submitting NRD name, address, and telephone number
  - Support information including:
    - Background information (history, community groups who are involved)
    - Conservation activities (history, purpose and success)
    - Conservation management activities (type/effectiveness of care, replanting, attitude toward conservation, etc.)
    - Other support information (conservation promotion/educational activities, other conservation activities and awards, etc.)
    - Each nomination must include at least <u>four</u> photographs. You will be asked to obtain a photo of the nominee(s) if they are chosen as the winner.

2. Nominations must not exceed <u>two</u> typed, double-spaced pages. Please try and include any supplemental information, e.g. newspaper articles, four photographs, etc.

## **Procedure**

- Nominations must be submitted by a Natural Resources District. Local NRD community conservation award recipients or other NRD nominations are eligible. Any individual, organization or agency is encouraged to submit a nomination to a local NRD. Each NRD may submit only one nomination.
- 2. Nominations must be submitted to the NARD office by May 1.

- 3. The NARD Native Vegetation and Forestry Subcommittee will serve as the selection committee.
- 4. The recipient will be recognized at the NARD Annual Fall Conference. The NARD Executive Director or his/her designee will present the award.
