LBNRD QUICK FACTS:

The Little Blue River Basin drains about 2,691 square miles or 1,722,200 acres of 11 South Central Nebraska counties. Approximately 1,495,234 acres are nonfederal lands of which 1,387,800 are agricultural lands.

All or parts of seven counties make up the Little Blue District: Thayer, Jefferson, Fillmore, Clay, Nuckolls, Webster and Adams Counties.

The total area of the Little Blue District is approximately 1,537,280 acres. The District has sixteen major subwatersheds.

LBNRD Leaving a Legacy of Conservation

Highlights of 40 Years of Accomplishments

- District completed a Hydrogeological Study of the entire District in 2011. (Check it out on the WEB- www.littlebluenrd.org)
- Since 1973 the Little Blue NRD has planted 1,927,586 trees.
- Has established six Recreational Areas: Lone Star, Liberty Cove, Buckley Creek, Prairie Lake, Roseland Lake and Bruning Dam.
- Since 1977 built 113 private dams controlling 40,142 acres of drainage.
- Operate and maintain two rural Water Projects, serving over 400 domestic, livestock and business hookup

Local NRD Works Side by Side with You

- Measure 320 irrigation wells annually and daily logs on 48 dedicated monitoring wells to track groundwater levels.
- Sample 665 irrigation wells annually to track nitrates and pesticides.
- Require fertilizer management activities on over 230,500 acres of high priority water management areas.
- Assisted 24 communities in protecting their water supply through wellhead protection activities.
- Manage a chemigation inspection program for 767 irrigation systems.
- Decommissioned 1,683 old wells to protect water from contamination.
- Administer Buffer Strip Program to protect surface water and provide wildlife habitat.
- Completed nine-county Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- Provide cost-assistance to landowners to install hundreds of soil and water conservation practices and water quality measures.
- Provide various environmental education opportunities for youth.
- Cooperate in tire and electronic recycle efforts, and hazardous waste pickup.
- Constructed and maintain 27 flood control dams and one dike in six watershed providing 36,138 acre feet of flood storage.
