


2023 Spring Static Water Levels by: Kevin Orvis

This spring the water levels were completed in the month of April. The map above shows the changes between Spring 2022 and Spring 2023. This map shows a large majority of the District with declines. Geologic Area I was down -1.43 feet on average. Some of the hardest hit towns were Kenesaw, Deweese, Ong, Oak, Carleton, Belvidere, the areas between Hastings, Roseland, and Blue Hill. Geologic Area 2 went down -0.58 feet on average. The hardest hit area is around Fairbury and Reynolds. However, there was a small rise around Bryon, unfortunately this is the only area that saw a rise.

If you look at the weighted average spring water level graphs to the right, you will see we are getting closer to our trigger levels for allocations. In Geologic Area 1, the weighted average is sitting 2.01 feet above the trigger levels. If we drop another -2.01 feet, the Board of Directors will immediately put a Stay on expanding acres and installing high-capacity wells, if the groundwater level remains below that level for a second consecutive year, we will be into groundwater allocations. In Geologic Area 2, the weighted average is sitting 1.82 feet above the trigger levels. If we drop another -1.82 feet, the Board of Directors will immediately a Stay on expanding acres and installing high-capacity wells, if the groundwater level remains below that level for a second consecutive year, we will be into groundwater allocations.

Annual rainfall amounts of 24.25 to 30.23 inches leaves the water table fluctuating between declines and rises of I foot. Less than that seems to be a predictable decline while more than 32 inches results in a rise.

This information compares spring of 2022 to spring of 2023 static water levels. Fall 2023 will be collected beginning in October and will compare static water levels to fall of 2022.

Kyle has an extensive



Chemization by: Alicia Epps

The State of Nebraska gives each NRD the task of collecting payments and inspecting and reporting chemigation permits. By state law, a chemigation permit MUST be obtained before any person can legally chemigate.

New Permits: New chemigation permits cost \$60.00 per injection site. Permits should be paid prior to or at the time of inspection.

Renewing Permits: Renewal cost is \$20.00 per injection site. Renewed permits must be received by June 1, along with payment. Any permits not renewed before June 1 will be considered a new permit.

Inspections: Chemigation systems for new permits MUST be inspected and approved by the Little Blue NRD staff before initial use. Systems already inspected with a renew permit, are on three year rotation for inspections.



A stay means to halt, stop, or delay a well permit, action of development, or the expansion of irrigated acres.



2.2.7 - The Board has imposed stays in the portions of the District shown in the Appendix to these rules in figure 2. The stays imposed, land impacted, and their implementation date include:

2.2.73 - that portion of the Platte River Drainage area in Northwest Adams County where groundwater uses have been determined by Nebraska Department of Natural Resources modeling to impact Platte River stream flow by 10 percent in 50 years. (Effective 5.10.2018.)

2.2.7.1 - The portion of the paleovalley aguifer known as Unit 8, where high-capacity well permits, the expansion of new irrigated acres and the groundwater transers are prohibited (Effective March 16, 2006). The stratigraphic boundries for this stay area are from the land surface through the underlying water bearing silts, clays, sands, and gravels, and include the sandstones, siltstones, chalk, and shale formations which may contain groundwater below the unit.
